These values are your rights and the rights of everyone else in Britain, and it is your responsibility to promote this in QA, at work and at home

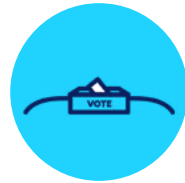


The Rule of Law

You have the right to live in law abiding society, where the law protects it's citizens. You are innocent until proven guilty.

You can promote support for the The Rule of Law by:

- Sticking within the rules set out in the QA In learning code of conduct & QA code of Conduct
- Respecting GDPR
- Using the learning platform in the way it was intended and not for purposes that break the law
- Promoting fair and non discriminatory behaviour and language
- Embody the rules and boundaries of the classroom that allow teaching and learning to flow uninterrupted.



Democracy

You have the right to live in a society where you can vote, and have your say on how things are done.

You can promote democracy by:

- Participating in QA surveys and offering views and perspectives.
- Getting involved with QA Sharepoint activities and expressing your voice in polls.
- Make suggestions around specific learning directions as a group as well as individually.
- Ensuring you vote in local and general elections with knowledge of each option. Bring this practise to life throughout your apprenticeship wherever you are able.



Individual Liberty

You have the right to live and speak freely.

You can promote Individual Liberty by:

- Practising the right to believe, act and express oneself freely whilst operating within the law and maintaining respect for those supporting you.
- Respecting the equality and diversity of all and remembering your own rights to anonymity, respect and dignity.
- Reading QAs Equality, Diversity and Inclusion Policy and practising the principles in your daily life.
- Embodying independent and free action whilst respecting and valuing help, support and advice from QA and that of the wider community.
- Utilising the freedom and skills you have to engage with what's on offer at QA, as well as seeking for next steps individually.
- By valuing your own choices and displaying a whole self to work mentality



Mutual Respect

You have the right to be respected and tolerated regardless of your background, culture, gender, age,sexuality, religion or belief.

You can promote mutual respect by:

- Using positive and inclusive language and behaviour at all times.
- Utilise resources that enhance your understanding of faiths and beliefs other than your own.
- Attend QA training and events that may challenge stereotypes and discrimination. Explore and broaden your knowledge and perspectives.
- Challenge yourself and your unconscious bias and behaviours. Safely challenge others.
- Seek support if you have concerns for yourself or others. Make yourself aware of what services are available at QA.
